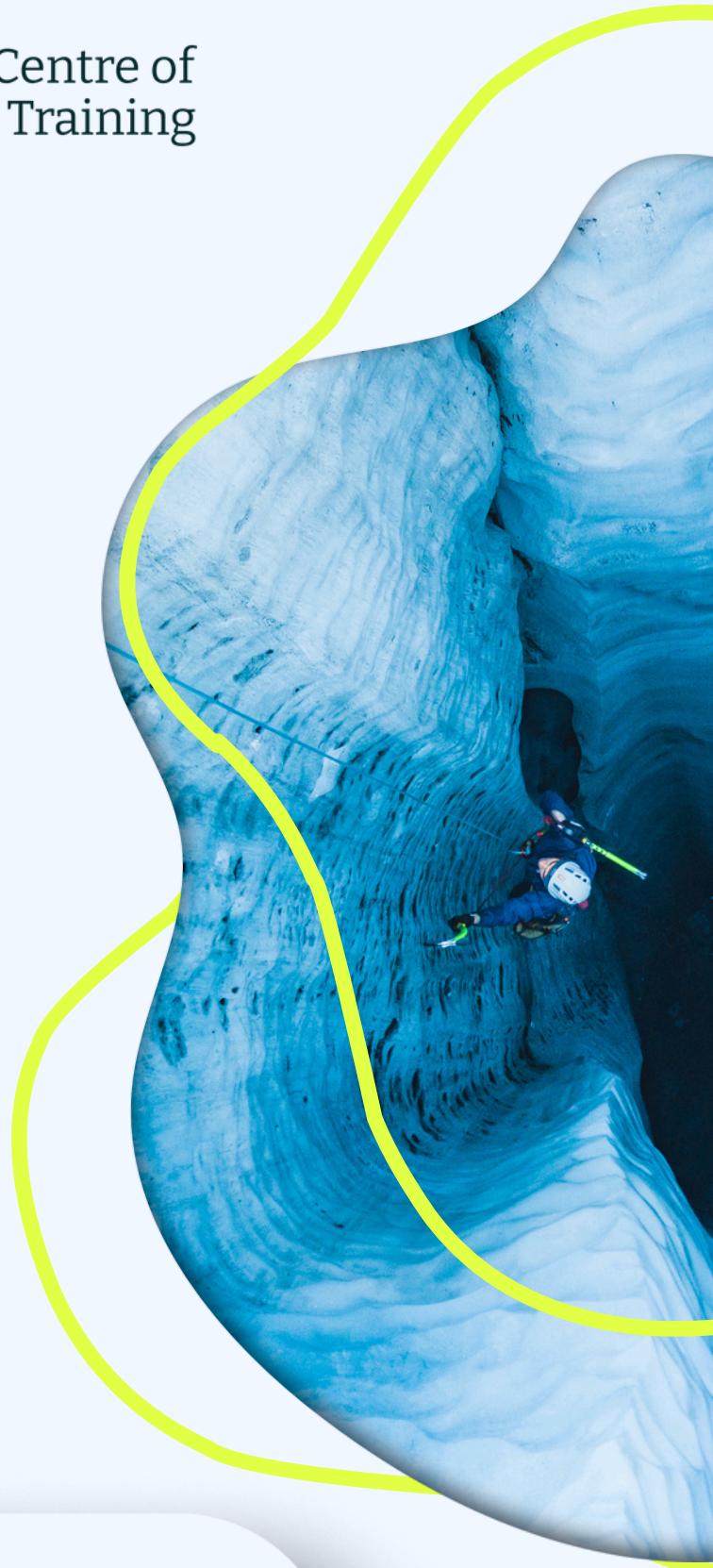

Our immersive programs combine technical skills development, leadership training, and industry certifications across multiple environments and seasons.

9-Month Comprehensive Program (Sept 2026 to June 2027) A complete journey through all aspects of adventure leadership, combining mountain, winter, and water skills with professional development and adventure tourism business.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The 9-month Adventure Guide Program is structured into three full-time trimesters (two months each). Each major training block focuses on progressive technical skills and leadership development, and industry certifications across Germany, Switzerland, and Iceland.

Program Timeline:

- **Fall Block - Germany, Garmisch-Partenkirchen:** (Mid-Sept to Mid-Nov) Focus on foundational skills, rock climbing and mountaineering in the Bavarian, Austrian & Italian Alps.
- **Winter Block - Switzerland, Villars-sur-Ollon & area:** (Mid-Jan to Mid-March) Develop winter sport expertise, avalanche safety, and ice climbing skills.
- **Spring Block - Iceland, Reykjavik & various locations:** (Mid April to Early June) Master glacier travel, water sports, and expedition leadership.

Between trimesters, a 6–8 week interval provides flexible time to travel, work seasonal jobs, complete online modules, practice and consolidate field skills, and prepare for the next block.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

We seek motivated individuals who demonstrate:

- Age Requirement: Minimum 18 years
- Language Skills: B1 level English proficiency (IELTS 5.5+, TOEFL 72+, or equivalent)
- Physical Preparation: Ability to participate in strenuous outdoor activities
- Swimming Competency: Intermediate-level swimming ability required
- Winter Sports: Basic skiing ability preferred (can be discussed individually)
- Previous Experience: No specific outdoor experience required, but enthusiasm essential



VISA INFORMATION

EU passport holders face no specific entry requirements for program participation in all three program locations (Germany, Switzerland, and Iceland).

For non-EU citizens, we recommend applying for a German National Visa (Type D) for long-term stays up to one year.

Since visa regulations vary by nationality and program duration, we strongly advise:

1. Consulting the German embassy in your home country
2. Verifying specific requirements for your nationality
3. Beginning the application process at least 3 months before program start

APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 1: Initial Contact

- Review program requirements
- Discuss program fit with us - schedule an information session (phone/online/in-person)

Step 2: Formal Application

- Submit completed application form online (<https://www.ecat-edu.com/apply-now>)
- Provide all required documentation (email to: info@ecat-edu.com):
 - a. Current CV/resume
 - b. Statement of intent (400 words max)
 - c. Medical form (will be requested once all other admission requirements are met)
 - d. English proficiency evidence (only if English is not your first language, provide proof of B1 language certificate)
 - e. Short summary of your outdoor adventure sport experience and copy of outdoor related certification (if available)
 - f. Two reference contacts (can be work or academic related)
 - g. Copy of a valid passport

Step 3: Interview

- After reviewing the required documentation we will arrange (if still necessary) a personal interview (online or in-person)

Step 4: Acceptance

- Receive acceptance decision
- Pay registration fee
- Complete & submit medical form
- Arrange payment schedule
- Start visa application process (if applicable)
- Submit proof of health insurance
